The 35th Anniversary Tea Party and June Meeting

The June General Meeting was brief to allow for the final celebration of the 35th Anniversary of NEORQC with an Afternoon Tea Party. The concept for NEORQC was presented by Cindy Casciato at a Quilters Tea in Atwater, Ohio in May 1988. A letter followed to quilting organizations throughout the 22-county area. In response, 32 women met at the home of Carole Wooten in August 1988 to begin planning. In October 1988, an organizational planning meeting was hosted by North Coast Needlers. Membership at this meeting was 16 guilds and 3 shops. The first NEORQC meeting was hosted in March 1989 by Common Threads Quilt Guild as a Tea Party. To close out our 35th anniversary year was fitting to end with a Tea Party as the organization started at one.

The attendees were dressed in their best hats and enjoyed refreshments and party games. The refreshments included flavored teas, lemonade, egg salad sandwiches, dainty cucumber sandwiches, radish herb butter sandwiches, hummus salad sandwiches, mozzarella tomato and basil skewers, scones, lavender shortbread cookies, spritz cookies, snowball cookies, fruit cup, banana muffins, honey, and homemade blackberry jam. Cindy Casciato provided each attendee with an Accuquilt Steam a Seam Tea Pot and a pattern. A handout with the tradition of afternoon tea along with a table favor of a tea towel with a teaspoon and a tea bag was given to each attendee. The game winners received gifts from the NEORQC Board.
